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## CACHE Level 2 – Certificate for the Children & Young People's Workforce

If you are working in a supervised role with children or young people aged 0–19 years or on a professional placement, then this Certificate for the Children & Young People's Workforce is the qualification you need to undertake to become a practitioner. It can be undertaken as part of a full time apprenticeship scheme and will then include functional skills and paediatric first aid.

The qualification is made up of **13 mandatory units** and a bank of **optional units**. Each unit is awarded credits and to achieve the qualification a minimum of **35 credits** must be completed.



- Attendance at a weekly class delivers the underpinning knowledge
- This award should normally be achieved in 12 months
- You need to be in a work setting in the practitioner role to demonstrate competence in both knowledge and skills

This award will be assessed through observation in a work setting and production of a portfolio of work products, witness testimony & reflective accounts, along with written assignments.

### Mandatory Units = 31 credits

- Intro to communication, health, social care or children & young people's settings (HSC)
- Intro to equality and inclusion in HSC
- Intro to personal development in HSC
- Child and young person development
- Contribute to the support of child & young people's development
- Safeguarding the welfare of children & young people
- Contribute to children & young people's health & safety
- Support children & young people's positive behaviour
- Contribute to and support positive environments for children & young people
- Understand partnership working in services for children & young people
- Paediatric emergency first aid
- Managing paediatric illness & injury
- Maintain & support relationships with children & young people

### Optional Units = minimum of 4 credits

- Choose from a selection of optional units which must add up to a minimum of 4 credits
- There is an opportunity to select Level 3 optional units to transfer onto a progression award

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## CACHE Level 3 – Diploma for the Children & Young People's Workforce

This qualification is aimed at practitioners working or in a professional placement unsupervised with children or young people aged between 0–19 years

It can be undertaken as part of a full time advanced apprenticeship scheme, this includes functional skills and paediatric first aid.

There are **11 core mandatory units, plus pathway mandatory units** and a bank of **optional units**. Each unit is awarded credits and to achieve the qualification a minimum of **65 credits** must be completed.



- Attendance at a weekly class delivers the underpinning knowledge
- This award should normally be achieved in 12 months
- You need to be in a work setting in the practitioner role to demonstrate competence in both knowledge and skills

This award will be assessed through observation in a work setting and production of a portfolio of work products, witness testimony & reflective accounts, along with written assignments.

### Core Mandatory Units = 27 credits

- Promote communication in health, social care or children's & young people's settings (HSC)
- Promote equality and inclusion in HSC
- Engage in personal development in HSC
- Principles for implementing duty of care in HSC
- Understand child and young person's development
- Promote child and young person development
- Understand how to safeguard the well being of children & young people
- Support children & young people's health and safety
- Develop positive relationships with children, young people and others involved in their care
- Working together for the benefit of children & young people
- Understand how to support positive outcomes for children & young people

**There are 3 pathways**, each have mandatory units which are awarded credit values

1. Early Learning and Childcare pathway = 22 credits
2. Social Care pathway = 13 credits
3. Learning & Development Support Services pathway = 13 credits

### Optional Units = making up additional 16–25 credits needed

- A bank of specialist optional units to choose from depending on knowledge and competency skills

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
